



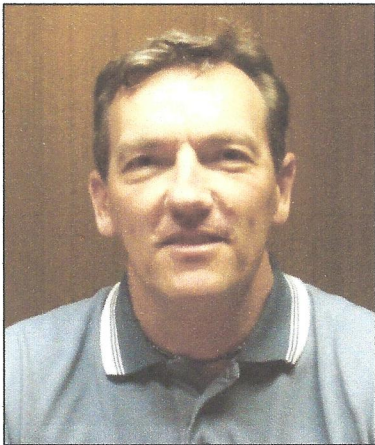

Understand and follow the cleaning instructions for your leather. US-produced furniture will have a deck label under the seat cushion. Latitudes products will have a hang tag. We recommend using professional leather protectants and cleaners (check out www.uniter.com).

The basics

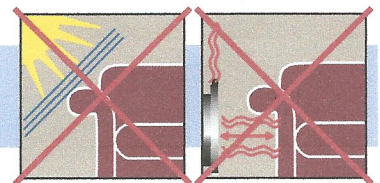
Sharp objects, pets, and even rhinestones on the back pockets of pants can cut leather.



#2

Excessive sunlight and heat

Both of these may cause fading and cracking.

Harsh cleaning agents and body oils

Alcohol-based, petroleum-based, and even some water solubles can damage leather because of the dyes in the water solubles. Hair products, body lotions, and even medications can all affect your leather.
